[Our Impact]

Adding up Heal the Bay's achievements in the past year.

Science

- Our analysts monitored ocean water quality for more than 600 West Coast beaches on a weekly basis last year via our Beach Report Card®, alerting the public to bacterial pollution that can cause illness. Beyond protecting public health, the data supported our advocacy initiatives to identify and fix pollution sources.
- Each month, members of citizen-scientist Stream Team canvassed the Santa Monica Mountains, restoring native habitat and collecting data to identify water quality problems. In a bid to protect one of L.A.'s last remaining open spaces, we also published a landmark 10-year study on the Malibu Creek Watershed and convened several Town Hall meetings to share the findings.

Advocacy

- Millions of sharks will be saved this year thanks to AB 376, state legislation for which Heal the Bay mobilized statewide support. Shark fin sales and possession are now illegal in California. The new law goes a long way toward protecting these apex predators, which are essential to a healthy ocean environment.
- In 2014, Los Angeles became the biggest city in the country to ban single-use plastic grocery bags. Working with L.A. City Council members, it took more than six years of our hard work and diligence to help draft and enact the ordinance. But now an estimated two billion plastic bags each year will be kept out of our ocean, rivers, parks, streets and other public places.



[Our Goals]

We've been making Southern Californian waters safer, healthier and cleaner since 1985.

Here's a look at the year ahead:

- Upholding the moratorium on oil drilling in Santa Monica Bay, which is threatened by a proposal to conduct slant-drilling operations off Hermosa Beach.
- Supporting strict limits on a planned string of ocean-based desalination plants along the California coast to protect marine life.



[Our Supporters]

Education

- In 2013, we provided 2,200 hours of hands-on environmental education for area students, guiding youth through our regional creeks and rivers, bringing ocean science to inland classrooms through our Speakers Bureau program and providing unforgettable field trips to local beaches.
- Our Santa Monica Pier Aquarium serves as a vibrant marine education hub, engaging nearly 80,000 visitors a year through our public hours, programs, camps and field trips. The Aquarium, which only features species found off our local shoreline, allows visitors to experience the Bay first-hand.

Community Action

- Our beach cleanup efforts do make a difference. Last year, Heal the Bay volunteers removed more than 32,000 pounds of ocean-bound trash. In the past 20 years, we have collected more than 2 million pounds of debris – that's almost the weight of two fully loaded 747 passenger jets!
- Through our EPA-award winning Angler Outreach program, we use six languages and span local piers to reach 10,000 subsistence fishermen a year with information on how to avoid consuming contaminated fish.
- Advocating for a regional, public funding measure that would underwrite numerous multi-benefit, clean-water projects throughout Los Angeles.
- Collecting data and training dozens of volunteers to monitor newly established Marine Protected Areas – so-called "Yosemites of the Sea" – in Palos Verdes and Point Dume.
- Building a community park in South Los Angeles that will capture and filter urban runoff, serving as a model for similar projects throughout the Southland that provide needed open space and water quality improvements.

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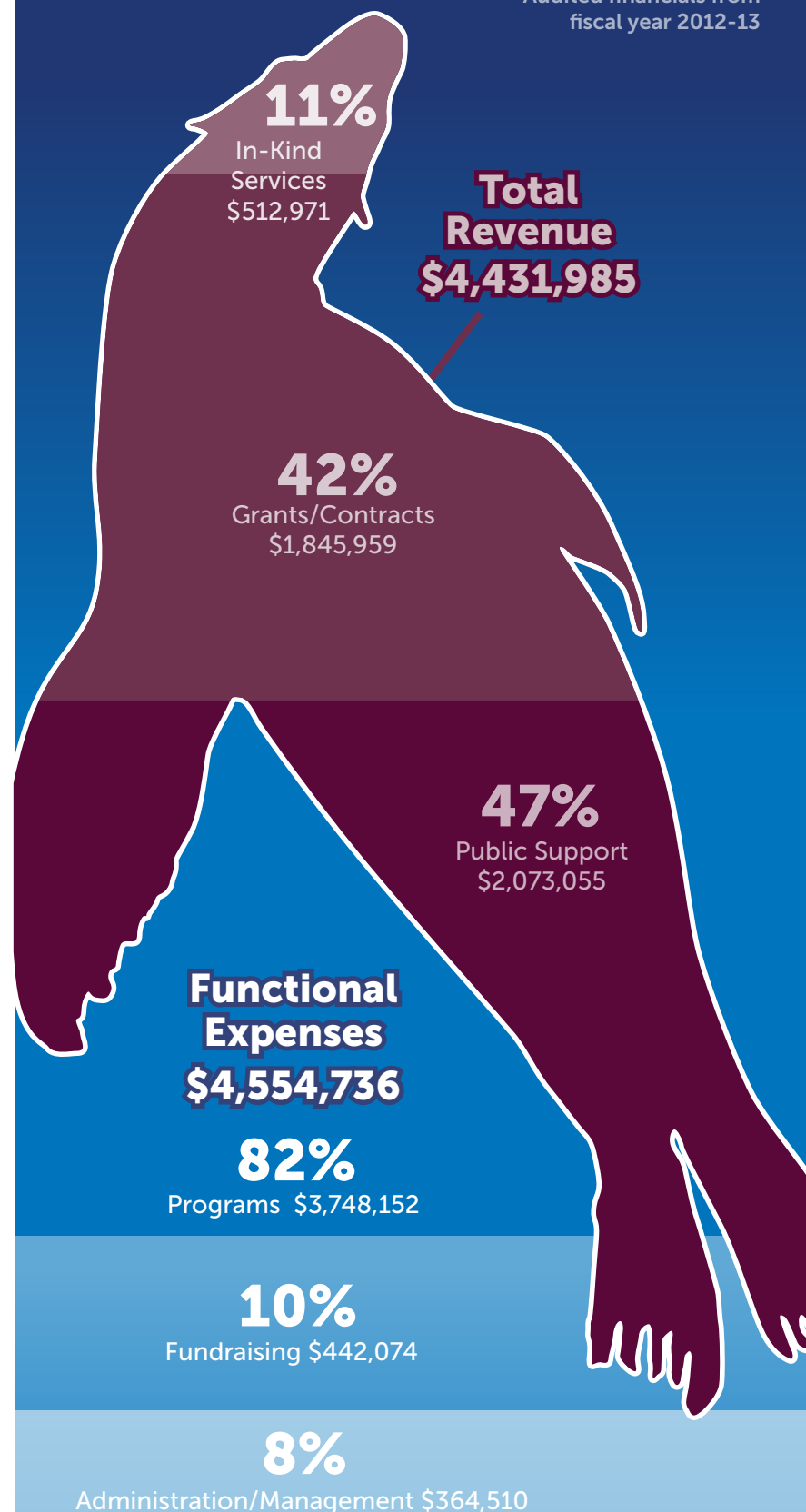
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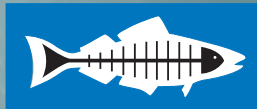
