






Last month the Santa Monica Pier Aquarium unveiled a very special exhibit: the endangered tidewater goby. We are one of only two aquaria where the public can see this special local species. This goby is a tiny bottom-dwelling fish that lives in marshes, lagoons, creeks and estuaries of California. Tidewater gobies are tough little fish. They can survive in freshwater or in water saltier than the ocean. They can live in water as cold as 46F to water as hot as 87F. They can even survive in water with virtually no dissolved oxygen. Yet, as mighty as these tiny fish are, they cannot survive losing their homes. The species is now endangered due to coastal development, the degradation of its habitat and human alteration of naturally occurring water flows. Stop by and meet this charismatic little fish in our newly renovated Dorothy Green Room and learn more about how you can help save the species from extinction.
